We have a strong emphasis on delivering a traditional 'Core' education for all of our students. We pride ourselves on being one of the few schools in the area to still offer the Triple Sciences (Biology, Chemistry and Physics) as separate subjects at GCSE and we ensure that all students, no matter their ability, study English Literature to GCSE. We believe it is important that all students are offered a strong and rigorous academic education as this is fundamental to employers, colleges and sixth forms; this is the education that they want their future students to have.

'Core' subjects is never less than consistently Good and predominantly Outstanding, leading to some impressive levels of progress in English, maths and science. We offer a varied range of learning activities within lessons, concentrating on individualised and independent learning approaches to tailor the learning experience to each child. We also offer many opportunities for further study both within the school day and also after school; we ensure that the students in our school have the very best chance to achieve their true potential.

World class facilities

Our facilities for a modern-day learning experience are second to none, with each teacher being well-versed in using ICT to aid lesson planning and delivery. Our school resources include banks of iPADs, a large number of computer suites and many other resources to help our staff ensure the students in their care flourish.

Our curriculum teams rigorously monitor, and respond to, national changes including the current GCSE reforms, thus ensuring that our staff and students are always well-prepared for their examinations. One such development is the new curriculum in maths where the department are one of only three schools in the North-East to have adopted the 'Maths Mastery' approach to learning; this is an extremely well-researched programme designed to develop maths skills in real-life situations, allowing for a stronger depth of learning and more interactive ways of solving maths problems. Our English department are closely linked to other schools, Durham Local Education Authority and wider federations of schools across the country and are often called upon to deliver training and advice to other schools and education authorities.

Wellfield School is proud of its international link to South Africa. Since 2008, we have enjoyed a well-established partnership with Schietsdrift Combined School in Kwazulu-Natal.

Since first finding out about the rural and very disadvantaged Zulu school, staff and pupils of Wellfield have raised money to support improvements to the building, resources and education there. More recently the schools have enjoyed reciprocal visits so that we can all benefit from each other's experiences of education to improve teaching and learning in our own schools as well as build strong relationships between the two communities.

During a recent visit to South Africa, Wellfield students supported learning and taught lessons in Schietsdriff School and created a library for the Zulu pupils to use to help improve their literacy in English skills. Our visits also give students the opportunity to develop personal skills, to become more independent and to understand that the world is a global community.

We offer a fantastic opportunity for our students to learn about life in South Africa and the Zulu heritage through these visits and our special South Africa curriculum weeks and assemblies.


Extra Curricular

Wellfield School has a wide range of extra-curricular Performing Arts activities. These include the school choir who perform at various events in both local and regional venues (including the Sage in Gateshead) and many peripatetic teachers who cover many different instruments including brass, guitar, drums and voice.

We also produce two full scale productions each year - these shows are an important part of school life and are very well received by our local community. We recently produced "Grease" which featured 75 of our students and played to sell-out audiences during its run. The second show is part of our transition work and takes the form of our Performing Arts Summer School. Students in Years 4, 5 and 6 are joined by some of our own students, and they receive workshops in Dance, Drama and Music (including

singing and African drums). The students work with us for the first two weeks of the Summer Holidays and the Summer School culminates in performances to friends and family.

Moving Up

At Wellfield we are very proud of the links with our Primary and Junior Schools. We see these as vital to make sure the transition between Key Stage 2 and 3 is as successful as possible.

We know that Moving Up from primary to secondary school is a big step. The changes and challenges are very exciting but can be quite daunting, even for the most confident child. At Wellfield we have a full transition programme to support parents and pupils. This programme starts before the pupils reach Year 6. The pupils are introduced to the people who will help to make this transition time as positive as possible.

To make sure each pupil has the best possible start at Wellfield a lot of time is spent gathering information from Primary and Junior Schools. Assessment information is analysed to ensure every pupil is placed in the correct set for every subject and receives appropriate academic support. In addition our staff deliver lessons in the primary schools and support with Pastoral information is also collected and each pupil

is given the opportunity to choose at least one friend to be with in the same Tutor Group.

Throughout the year there are many opportunities for pupils to visit Wellfield School and our staff teach a range of subjects in the primary schools. Pupils from all of our local schools are invited for lunch on a regular basis. Wellfield host the Primary School Maths Challenge. This is an event for every primary school in the county.

Wellfield pupils help with every transition event and the school council organise two of the largest events themselves. These are a Halloween Spectacular and a celebration of Chinese New Year.
